What information we collect, use and why

We collect or use the following information for educational reasons and fundraising purposes:

- Names and contact details
- Date of birth
- Photographs or video recordings
- Records of meetings and decisions
- Identification documents
- Information relating to compliments or complaints
- Criminal offence data (including Disclosure Barring Service (DBS), Access NI or Disclosure Scotland checks)
- Recorded images, such as photos or videos
- Records of consent, where appropriate
- Information on children's emotional and educational needs, and behavioural challenges
- Racial or ethnic origin

Lawful bases

Our lawful bases for collecting or using personal information for educational reasons and fundraising purposes are:

- Consent
- Legitimate interest: The more detailed an understanding we have of children's emotional and educational needs, and behavioural challenges, the more we will be able to tailor our provision of music education.

Where we get personal information from

- People directly
- Schools, colleges, universities or other education organisations
- Parents/carers

Who we share information with

Others we share personal information with:

- Organisations we need to share information with for safeguarding reasons
- Other relevant third parties such as music teachers who we engage on a contractual basis and Trustees of the Orchestra of Everything Foundation

Embedded content from other websites

Your data protection rights

Under data protection law, you have rights including:

- Your right of access – You have the right to ask us for copies of your personal data.
- Your right to rectification – You have the right to ask us to rectify personal data you think is inaccurate. You also have the right to ask us to complete information you think is incomplete.
- Your right to erasure – You have the right to ask us to erase your personal data in certain circumstances.
- Your right to restriction of processing – You have the right to ask us to restrict the processing of your personal data in certain circumstances.
- Your right to object to processing – You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data in certain circumstances.
- Your right to data portability – You have the right to ask that we transfer the personal data you gave us to another organisation, or to you, in certain circumstances.
- Your right to withdraw consent – When we use consent as our lawful basis you have the right to withdraw your consent. If you make a request, we have one calendar month to respond to you. To make a data protection rights request, please contact us using the contact details at the top of this privacy notice.

How to complain

If you have any concerns about our use of your personal data, you can make a complaint to us using the contact details at the top of this privacy notice.

If you remain unhappy with how we've used your data after raising a complaint with us, you can also complain to the ICO.
